General Information on the Directing Training

As a specialised academy, the Otto Falckenberg School offers directing training that differs in certain aspects from training at a university. Specialised academies provide practice-oriented vocational training and this is the case at the Otto Falckenberg School thanks to its close link to the Münchner Kammerspiele: our students are integrated into the life of the theatre right from the start.

This is not least guaranteed by the two mandatory assistant directorships undertaken by our students in the second year of the course. This means we are not only able to offer the very few students we accept onto the course a practice-oriented training, but also the opportunity for individual artistic development. We consider it essential for our students to accompany the rehearsal processes of experienced directors and to be actively involved in the operations of a theatre.


At the Otto Falckenberg School, there is no dominant concept about what a director should be. The students are expected to influence the course of their studies with their own interests, individual (theatre) experiences, their existing knowledge and their biographies. In order to ensure that everyone gets as much out of the training as possible, we work according to the mentor principle where each piece of practical work is individually supervised.

Structure of the Theoretical Training

Participation in the acting theory classes.

The theoretical directing training takes place across all years in the directing class.

The following courses are taught continuously or in cycles:

- o Conceptual work / project development, project presentation
- o Directing seminar with theatre makers from the Münchner Kammerspiele,

Residenztheater, Volkstheater, Schauburg and others

- o Reading course
- o Production analysis
- o Art history, curator tours and artist talks

Examinations

First Year:

- o Test at the end of the probationary period
- o Assessment of artistic development so far and testing of theoretical knowledge

Second Year:

- o Intermediate exam
- o Verification of technical and individual development

Fourth Year:

- o Final exam
- o Successful independent conception, planning and implementation of graduation production
- o Joint theory exam with the acting department
